

How has the City of Lancaster's spending changed over time?




Between 2014-2019, spending on "Public Safety & General Government" increased by 58%. Budget categories changed in 2017, but between 2003-2017, Public Safety made up an average of 72% of this category (71% median).



How does the Los Angeles Sheriff Department's Contract with the city fit in?

Lancaster's Public Safety Department manages the LASD contract. Each year, the contract accounts for an average of 87% of the Public Safety Budget. Between 2019-2021, the Sheriff's Contract budget grew12% (\$3 million)

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In 2021, Non-Sheriff Department Public Safety expenses in Lancaster include \$2.3 in operating expenses and \$1.4 million in personnel services. There are 3 total public safety officers and 9 administrative staff that exist outside of the LASD contract.








How has the City of Palmdale's spending changed over time?

Public Safety & General Government has consistently represented one of the top budget priorities in Palmdale. Between 2003-2017, Public Safety spending alone increased by 65%. In the same timeframe, Health, Culture & Leisure increased by 10%. However, between 2017-2019, this category reached its lowest budget since before 2003.



How does the Los Angeles Sheriff Department's Contract with the city fit in?

Palmdale's Public Safety and Community Compliance departments manage the Sheriff's Contract. The Sheriff's Department contracts account for an average of 87% of their total budgets. Between 2018-2021, the Sheriff Contract budget increased by 16.6%


In 2021, the non LASD-contract public safety expenses total to \$1.9 million and a million-dollar Animal Control contract with the county and a budget for 5 total staff (1 neighborhood service specialist, 1 office assistant, 2 public safety specialists, and 1 public safety supervisor).


The Sheriff's Contract includes liability payments. Between 2020 and 2021, contract liability appropriations increased by 11%. Contract liability was not reported in previous budgets years.

Between 2019-2021, the LASD contract has accounted for an average of 34% of Palmdale's total General Fund expenditures. In 2021, will account for 36% of all expenditures.


